CITY OF NORCO FORMS NEW NORCO YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL *The City Clerk's Office Will Accept Applications Through September 13, 2016*

NORCO, CA: The City of Norco is accepting applications to serve on the newly established Norco Youth Advisory Council. The deadline to submit applications is 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 13, 2016. Applications will not be received or considered after that date. The Norco City Council will consider and make the appointments at the City Council meeting on September 21, 2016. Applications will be accepted to fill nine (9) positions. Terms are one year (October – May), coinciding with the school year.

Requirements to serve on the Norco Youth Advisory Council include: being a current registered student, grades 9 – 12, at Norco High School or John F. Kennedy Middle College High School; never have been convicted of a felony; and must take the Oath of Office.

The newly established Norco Youth Advisory Council shall be empowered to promote community involvement with, for, and by youth, review proposals for programs, projects, and facilities as they pertain to youth; assist in the evaluation and planning of programs and services with an emphasis on youth; review and make recommendations on matters pertaining to youth programming and services to the various City Commissions and the City Council; promote youth involvement in community events, programs, and volunteer projects through public education, schools, and community organizations,
