CITY MANAGER UPDATE

WOODBIDGE CROSS COUNTRY CLASSIC AT SILVERLAKES

Silverlakes will host the "36th Annual Woodbridge Cross Country Classic," (Invitational only), sponsored by Skechers, and hosted by Woodbridge High School from Riverside. The meet will be held on Friday, September 16, 2016, starting at 4:50 pm and Saturday, September 17, 2016, starting at 3:50 pm. The meet will give everyone the unique opportunity to run under the lights and under ideal weather conditions for September. The meet will be conducted within the interior perimeter of Silverlakes. The course does not leave the facility. The meet will have an entry gate fee of \$8.00 taken at the Citrus gate. QUARTERLY NAVY MEETING

Representatives from Senator Roth, Assemblyman Linder; Supervisor Tavaglione, Norco City Council, Lake Norconian Club Foundation and Historic Preservation Commission met with City Manager and Navy officials to review capital improvements at the Navy's facility in Norco. The purpose of these ongoing quarterly meetings is to ensure that proposed improvements at the facility are undertaken in ways that ensures the protection of historic integrity of properties at the installation. Among other things, the Navy provided new information regarding the status of two major improvements. It was noted during the meeting that major improvements to building 511 involving interior and exterior improvements to provide food service onsite to employees have been deferred because the contract with potential food service contractor has been terminated. The contractor could not commit to funding the cost of required improvements. The Navy will proceed with some of the improvements through a separate contract. The Navy is currently soliciting additional vendors (including local vendors) to provide food service at the Norco base. It was also noted during the meeting that the Navy's plan to install photovoltaic arrays has been delayed because the Navy's Renewable Energy Program Office (REPO) is currently reviewing new technology options other than solar panels. The City and the Navy have had significant discussions over the last two years regarding the negative environmental impacts of the proposed photovoltaic arrays.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

ARCHIVAL ASSISTANCE

At its meeting of September 12, 2016, the Historic Preservation Commission approved a \$6,000 contract for Chuck Wilson, a veteran archivist who has worked at University of California, Riverside, UCLA and the State of California Archives, to assist with the Norco Historic Collection housed at the Community Center. Mr. Wilson will organize the Collection, create a database and ensure of the proper handling of historic photos, manuscripts and artifacts. 

<p>CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE (CDFA) – 9/1/16-9/30/16 - CDFA has issued a Notice of Preparation (NOP) for a Program Environmental Impact Report and the public scoping period identified above for the proposed Medical Cannabis Cultivation Program pursuant to the Medical Cannabis Regulation and Control Act that was signed into law by Governor Brown in late 2015. That Law consisted of three separate bills (AB 243, AB 266, and SB 643) and outlines the regulation and enforcement of medical cannabis production in California with CDFA as the state licensing agency. The MCCP will establish the licensing regulations for medical cannabis production sites throughout the state. The nearest public scoping workshops to Norco will be on Sep. 27th, 2016 (4-7 pm) at the Pasadena Convention Center, 300 East Green St, Pasadena; and Sep. 28th, 2016 (4-7 pm) at the Miracle Springs Resort and Spa, 10625 Palm Dr., Desert Hot Springs. The City of Norco updated its laws and regulations to be consistent with the three bills (AB 243, AB 266, and SB 643) and the cultivation, sale, and production of medical cannabis is not permitted within City limits.</p>



FISCAL AND SUPPORT SERVICES UPDATE

BILL PROCESSING

Staff mailed out 1,527 utility bills to Group 1 customers and assessed penalties to 277 delinquent accounts totaling \$8,117. We also mailed out 238 delinquent notices and billed for tag fees totaling \$3,808 to Group 4 utility customers that had not paid their bill on time.

BUSINESS LICENSE AND CASH RECEIPTS

There were 19 new business license applications received during the week and 22 renewal applications totaling \$4,734. Staff processed a combined total of 1,489 cash receipts from the building counter, Parks and Recreation, utility customers and other miscellaneous accounts receivables totaling \$495,926. This week the City received \$25,081 of ½% sales tax.

MISCELLANEOUS ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

A total of 16 miscellaneous accounts receivable invoices were sent to individuals/agencies totaling \$2,733. Miscellaneous accounts receivable invoices are sent to bill for EMS services, hydrant meter billing, damage to City property, encroachment permits, loan payments, trash billing to California Rehabilitation Center and any other services provided by the City other than utility billing and business licenses.

CAL FIRE HAND CREWS

Resident’s may have noticed CAL FIRE Norco Camp Hand Crews hard at work around the City of Norco. The primary function of a CAL FIRE Norco Camp Hand Crew is to construct fire line by hand in areas where heavy machinery cannot be used due to steep topography, rocky terrain, or areas that may be considered environmentally sensitive. They are also known as CAL FIRE “ground attack” resources. This year CAL FIRE Norco Camp Hand Crews have logged a total of 4,340 man hours on fires throughout California. When not assigned to emergency response, Hand Crews conduct labor-intensive project work on public lands. Hand Crews from Norco Camp have already logged more than 1,500 hours of work in the City of Norco this year! Norco Conservation Camp Crews have done a variety of task in the city which includes: weed abatement, tree trimming, sandbagging, landscape and irrigation work, fencing, and horse trails. CAL FIRE is especially proud to call Norco home and we look forward to the continued partnership with the City for years to come.
