VETERANS MEMORIAL

The George A. Ingalls Veterans Memorial Plaza sits within the George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center and has approximately 2 acres dedicated to honor its veteran heroes.

The Memorial features a 70 foot flag pole surrounded by a “Circle of Honor” recognizing its current and past veterans and the various military armed services.

Included is “Lest We Forget” Columns of distinction honoring those local soldiers who gave the ultimate sacrifice while in service. The memorial pays honor to George A. Ingalls, a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient (posthumously).

The glorious facility has an amphitheater and seat walls to seat guests for special military services and those who visit to reflect and pay tribute.



FREE OPEN RECREATIONAL RIDING

The City of Norco offers the Clark Arena at the George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center for free Open Equestrian Recreational Riding on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The Arena is for recreation use only and may be subject to closure for events and maintenance

In the effort of Public Safety, the City of Norco has a helmet regulation. Chapter 9.56 Equestrian Helmet Regulation requires that riders 18 years of age or under must wear a (ASTM) or nationally accepted equine standard helmet.

THE GEORGE INGALLS EQUESTRIAN EVENT CENTER

The facility is a popular location for festivals, horse and dog shows, weddings, private parties and provides 80 acres of event facilities including two covered arenas, warm-up arenas, permanent seating, livestock pens, exhibit barns, banquet facilities, 1100 seat amphitheater, award-winning Pikes Peak Park and trails that connect to the City 130 miles pedestrian/equestrian trail system. This trail system links to the City's more than 700 acres of open space trails for hiking and horseback riding and neighborhood parks that promote the equestrian lifestyle.



MORENO ARENA

Located on over 80 acres and includes a 96,000 sq. ft. covered horse stadium. Included is a 150' x 250' arena with permanent bleacher seating for 2,100 spectators. It is equipped with holding pens, roping chutes and an elevated press box with a sound system to meet the needs of large scale rodeos and horse shows. This facility has permanent restrooms and shower facilities to accommodate large events. The covered facility can be transformed to host rodeos, BBQ festivals, specialty shows, dog shows and concerts.



CLARK ARENA

The Hal H. Clark Arena has an 84,000 sq. ft. cover including a 180' x 280' panel arena, show office equipped with sound system, permanent restrooms with showers, LED lighting and drop down power to accommodate large event demonstrations, presenters, clinicians and exhibitor type events as well as agricultural and equestrian events.



NELLIE WEAVER HALL / AMPITHEATER

A 10,000 sq. ft. multi purpose building with banquet lighting and a stage can seat 400 banquet style or 500 auditorium style. The facility is climate controlled and includes a full commercial kitchen, 30ft bar, dance floor and both interior and exterior restrooms. The facility can accommodate private events, special events, serve as a large meeting room, host trainings, seminars and entertainment shows or dances.



POLE BARN

The 4H level with two pole barns is constructed of wood poles and a metal steel roof. There are three buildings that have a combine total of 7,380 sq. ft. These buildings are available for rent for large and small livestock shows and can also be transformed to host rustic western-themed weddings and other special events or can be customized to serve as a staging area to host picnics, intimate concerts and private events.

PIKES PEAK PARK

It boasts 8.4 acres and features a tot lot, open grass area, restrooms, gazebo with BBQ brazer, picnic tables, horseshoe pits and ½ court basketball. This park was awarded the 2008 Award of Excellence in the Park Development and Design category from California Parks and Recreation Society. The large park gazebo is perfect for company picnics, family gatherings and private event use. Pikes Peak Park features three plus acres of grass area that has hosted numerous dog shows, American Cancer Relay for Life and Bark for Life events and can be used for additional parking during large events.

DOG LICENSING

Norco residents are allowed to purchase a one, two or three year dog license as long as the Rabies Vaccination will not lapse during the licensing period. All dogs are required by law to be licensed by the age of four (4) months. To purchase a dog license, the dog must be vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian and the owner must provide a California approved rabies vaccination certificate. Initial rabies vaccinations are good for a 12-month period, but subsequent vaccinations will provide up to three (3) years of protection. Reduced licensing fees are available with proof of this spay or neuter sterilization. Remember, a licensed dog identifies the dog and the owner.

WHY DO I NEED A YEARLY DOG LICENSE IN NORCO?

The State of California Health and Safety Code, (Section 121690) requires that all dogs over the age of 4 months be licensed. A valid rabies certificate must be provided before a dog can be licensed in the city. The license is the tool used to insure all dogs are up to date on rabies vaccination. It is also a great way to insure that if your dog gets out of its yard, it is returned to you quickly. Multi-year licenses with discounts are available, and seniors 62 or over will be offered a senior rate on all altered dogs. All dog owners must renew their dog's license when they are due. Norco Animal Control has begun issuing Administrative Tickets to owners that do not renew their dog's license in a timely manner.

WHY DID I GET A PINK NOTICE ON MY DOOR FROM ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES?

Officers canvass neighborhoods and leave a courtesy door hanger if we do not show any licensed dogs at your address. We frequently have new people moving into neighborhoods who may not be aware of licensing policies, and this allows us to keep new Norconians informed, as well as keeping records up-to-date. We appreciate those who take the time to call us and let us know they do not have any dogs. If you see our officers out in your neighborhood, take the time to say hello and feel free to ask our officers any animal control questions you may have!




