Stephanie Geiger, 6677 Whitewater, Mira Loma. Ms. Geiger stated to the Commission that he is a very good dad, and helps with her son every morning and has helped her on a daily basis. She also noted that it is very unfair to not allow his son Carson to play football.

Lois Locke Crestview, Norco, CA. Ms Locke discussed her articles in the Tattler and presented two weeks of the paper to the Commission. Ms. Locke further discussed that she had done research and noted that there isn't any entity in the City of Norco that can rent an entire park except for the Norco Valley Fair. Ms Locke also stated that she witnessed that Mr. Gregory did not cross the fence and enter the field. Lois also noted that the Norco Sheriff came up to Mr. Gregory and advised him to leave the premises or be locked up. Ms. Lock stated she hates injustice and that is what has happened to Mr. Gregory.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

A. Youth Sports Verbal Update – Superintendent Anglin updated the Commission on the last Youth Sports Advisory meeting held on October 13, 2009. NLL and NGSL are wrapping up winter ball this month. Both organizations are doing well. Both will be done immediately after Thanksgiving this year, however, they have been notified that next year the fields will be closed for maintenance starting Nov. 1, 2010. She noted that Staff has met with NGSL and NLL to confirm installation of scoreboards. RHA will provide plans to organizations for permit prior to installation. Leagues are responsible for the labor and cost incurred for the installation of the scoreboards. Superintendent Anglin informed the Commission that the NJAAF season is almost complete. Playoffs are starting with 9 out of 10 teams expected to be in playoffs. NJAAF will be hosting the semi-finals at NHS Nov. 28<sup>th</sup> or Dec. 5<sup>th</sup>.

Staff is awaiting next year's tentative league schedules along with any FAIR Applications for processing from this past season. Superintendent Anglin noted that staff and organizations discussed future plans to implement which will help recover cost for light use starting next traditional

season. Organizations will bring back to City ideas to further discuss which will then be brought to the Commission for discussion.

Sub-Committee Member Boyle discussed with the Sports Advisory Committee the possibility of light fees, the type of lights that may be installed, etc. Commissioner Boyle also noted that there was discussion regarding fund raising that the organizations can have to help them to gather monies to help them pay for light usage. Commissioner Boyle also noted that the organizations were asked to come up with recommendations on what their capabilities are for payment towards the possibility of light fees being charged.

Chair Hallam asked when the organizations will be coming back with their recommendations. Per Commissioner Boyle, the youth organizations have not met the date for their recommendations, which was today and have not submitted any recommendations to Superintendent Anglin, and have exceeded the date of response.

Chair Hallam asked if the organizations have notified their constituents on the correct information regarding light fees, and that the City is not trying to exclude the youth from sports.

The Director noted that the information that goes out to the general membership needs to be accurate, and concise. The information gathered will be coming back to the Commission when compiled.

11. COMMISSION ONGOING BUSINESS
  - A. Ingalls Park – Phase 1 of the demolition project has begun. The project is holding back a bit due to the CFR Rodeo which is being held next week.

Staff has had very good communication with So Cal Sandbags, CFR and Edmondson Construction regarding the event, and the total project. By the end of April, there will be several new items that will be seen at the event center.

- B. Animal Shelter Expansion – By the end of the year, the City should be in the process for the Notice to Invite Bids for the development of a new animal shelter – Chair Hallam asked if the pole barns would be there in April. The Director stated that they will not be available for Horseweek.
- C. Silverlakes/Belstarr – Staff is currently working along with attorneys for the Joint Use Agreement, along with the Master Use Agreement.
- D. Ridge Ranch Park – 2<sup>nd</sup> plan check is done, once the adjustments are made, the project will be ready to go to bid.
- E. Cultural and Fine Arts Programming
- F. Teen Programming and Teen Center –Supervisor Calvert noted that Chrystal Foster has returned after maternity leave. Chrystal is mentoring the local teens, and providing them with the opportunity to contribute to various City programs. This year staff would like to expand the program to help with the Special Olympics, beach clean up, and other community events. Eastvale Cub scouts have asked the teen group to help with their dinners. More discussion followed.
- G. U.N.L.O.A.D. Program – Commissioner Adams commented about Chrystal Foster and noted how sharp she is and had gotten Friday Night Live teens to participate with the City and the UNLOAD Committee. Commissioner Adams commended Chrystal on her enthusiasm and great programming efforts with the teen volunteers.
- H. Norco Hills Conservancy – A few people at CRC have been amiable to work with the Conservancy, and noted the Warden has retired. Commissioner Adams met the new Warden this morning, and was taken to the area that they have not been allowed in the past. Commissioner Adams feels encouraged by the new Warden. She also noted that the Fire Chief stated some reasons why the building cannot be saved, but she felt that he may be more on their sides than he thinks. Discussion continued.

The Director asked if the Conservancy should be separate from the Lake Norconian Foundation. Commissioner Adams explained to the Commission that the missions between the two groups is a bit different, and that the two organizations will separate to go forward with their concerns.

**13. OTHER MATTERS**

- A. Metro PCS Cell Site Update – Superintendent Anglin gave the Commission a quick update and presented a Power Point presentation to the Commission on this project. She noted it will be a Musco pole for the project. Construction timeline should be confirmed within the next two weeks. The Director noted that this Cell Site will coincide with the Lighting Project that will be taking place at the site.

- B. Parmenter Park Restroom Update – Superintendent Anglin presented a Power Point presentation regarding the Parmenter Park Restroom Project and noted that the restroom arrived two weeks ago and the installation should be complete within the next several weeks. The restroom sits at the Southeast corner of the park. Staff noted that plan check is in process for the sidewalk around the restroom, and landscaping plans
- C. Wee People Renovation Project began on November 2. The walls have been demolished, new sidewalks have been installed, the ADA entrance, the new framing has been completed. The project should be completed within the next three weeks. There will be new flooring, carpet, paint, countertops, cabinets. The project has a completion date of December 1, 2009.

Director Petree noted that staff will be going to City Council on November 18 with the Community Center Parking Lot Expansion project approval. Commissioner Holder asked about the house on Cedar Avenue and the horsetrail fencing issue. The Director noted that there have been meetings and the homeowners were invited to attend, and have not attended any of the meetings. This will be a part of Phase 2 of the Project.

The street light, closure, widening of Hamner is part of Phase 1.

Commissioner Boyle noted that it is not right that the child in the earlier presentation should not be able to play football. He noted that he will not tolerate a child not being able to play in youth sports.

Commissioner Wagner asked if the Chamber of Commerce has paid the City in full for their events. The Director noted that the City has been paid in full. The Riverside County Sheriff has not been paid in full for their services and the Director noted that there are several other groups have not been paid for their services.

Commissioner Wagner asked why we would rent the facility to the Chamber if they had outstanding bills with the City. The Director reiterated that the City has been paid in full; it is the County who will be taking up the issues of non payment to the County for Sheriff Services.

Chair Hallam asked if the Chamber of Commerce contract is in effect. The Director stated that there at this time is not a current contract with the Norco Chamber of Commerce for the 2010 Norco Valley Fair.

The Director noted that if the City and the Community are involved together to put on a fair, there may be other options to the event.

Commissioner Adams invited the Commission to attend the December 7, 2009 event at the Naval Base.

The Director noted he will be bringing the Santa Ana River Trails information back to the Commission within the next several months.

Chair Hallam asked what happened about the piece of land on Shadow Canyon. After discussion, the Commission was informed that the possibility of the Kay's purchasing the property. There are planning fees that would be enacted to be able to purchase this property on Shadow Canyon and at this time, the Kay's are not sure they want to pay the fees required by Planning.
