1. CITY COUNCIL ITEM:

- A. Presentation and Discussion Regarding the Potential for a New Contract with Waste Management Company for Integrated Waste Management Services. (Deputy City Manager/Director of Finance).

City Manager Groves introduced the item for discussion and presentation regarding the City's solid waste contract with Waste Management. The current contract expires on June 30, 2013. Staff representing Waste Management (WM) in attendance included Darrell Kato – Director of Operations, Mark Stackle – Director of Community Relations, Robert Ricci – District Manager, and Julie Reyes – Public Sector Services Manager. Deputy City Manager/Director of Finance Okoro, Deputy Public Works Director/Senior Engineer Askew and Public Works Director Thompson are the lead negotiators for the City and took part in the presentation.

Information presented included:

- Facts regarding Assembly Bill 939, SCAQMD Fleet Rule 1193 and Assembly Bill 341.
- Productivity and weight comparisons for residential and commercial services.
- New programs and enhancements of the proposed contract:
 - 10 year fixed term with a 5 year evergreen
 - "At your door" collection at the curb twice per year of household hazardous waste.
 - Collection of illegal dumped waste within 20 feet of the paved roadway within 48 hours of notification by the City.
 - WM will pay franchise fees on recyclable materials sales.
 - WM will provide the City with a commercial fluorescent lamp tracker recycling program for City-owned facilities (up to \$4,000 per year).
 - Senior discounts for basic service (62 years or older); not for manure service.
 - Proposed to eliminate commingled bins.
 - Discounted roll-off rates for non-profit organizations hosting events at Ingalls Park or Silverlakes.
 - E-waste collection (3 items per year at no charge as a part of the bulky item collection).

- o Public outreach and community awareness program provided by WM.
- Scout Service proposed rates.

- Long term disposal capacity and solutions were presented.
- Rate comparisons were shown using 9 other city's service and cart rates. (Average basic residential trash rate of \$23.15 – Norco current at \$20.36 and proposed at \$22.60).
- The WM performance overview was presented along with reasons why the City should continue to contract with them.

Staff recommended that the City continue to negotiate with Waste Management.

Motion by Higgins to continue to negotiate with WM for the best rates to compare and then send out a request for proposals. The motion died due to a lack of a second to that motion.

The Council Members, under discussion, commented on the negotiation and request for proposals process.

Motion by Sullivan to continue to negotiate with WM. The motion died due to a lack of a second to that motion.

The Council Members, under discussion, commented on the process that would work result in the best proposal for this service.

- A. Zone Code Amendment 2013-01 Amending Chapter 18.32 "Home Occupations;" and Code Amendment 2013-01: Amending Chapter 10.16 "Commercial Vehicles/Trucks" of the Norco Municipal Code, regarding the use and parking of commercial vehicles in residential zones.

The proposed changes to the Norco Municipal Code are to Chapter 10 (Vehicles and Traffic) and to the "Home Occupations" section of the Zoning Code (Chapter 18). The purpose for the changes is to clarify how and when a Residential Exemption Permit issued for the purpose of parking a commercial vehicle in a residential zone (otherwise prohibited) can be used when a home occupation business exists in the same location. The Planning Commission adopted Resolution 2013-06 on March 13, 2013, following clarification that any restrictions on commercial vehicles would not be applicable to horse trailers.

Recommended Action: Adopt Ordinance No. 961 for first reading. (Planning Director)

Planning Director King presented the public hearing item.

Council Member Higgins commented on comments he had sent to staff regarding this proposed ordinance, noting that his main concern is storage of construction equipment and what is seen from the right-of-way.

SUBJECT: Quarterly Investment Report for Quarter Ended March 31, 2013

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the City Council receive and file the Quarterly Investment Report for the Quarter Ended March 31, 2013.

SUMMARY: Staff is recommending that the City Council receive and file the City's quarterly investment report for the quarter ended March 31, 2013. This report has been prepared to meet the requirements of the City's Investment Policy and applicable sections of the State of California Government Code.

BACKGROUND/ ANALYSIS: The City's Investment Policy requires the Treasurer to render a quarterly report to the legislative body. The report is to be prepared in accordance with Government Code Section 53646 (b)(1) and should contain detailed information on all securities, investments, and monies of the local agency; a statement of compliance of the portfolio with the Statement of Investment Policy; and a statement of the City's ability to meet its cash flow requirements for the next six months. This report which is for the quarter ended March 31, 2013 meets the requirements of the Investment Policy and Government Code. It covers the City and Successor Agency to the former Norco Redevelopment Agency.

The attached schedules (attachments 1 through 4) have been prepared to meet the detailed requirements of the Government Code and the City's Investment Policy as approved by the Council on May 16, 2012. It is to be noted that the Investment Policy excludes certain investments (bond proceeds) from these requirements. This means that bond proceeds are invested in accordance with the provisions of the bond indentures rather than the provisions of the Investment Policy. Consequently, in determining whether the operating portfolio holdings are in compliance with the Government Code and the approved Investment Policy, investments of bond proceeds have been excluded.

Attachment 1 provides a summary schedule of the City's operating portfolio holdings by type as of March 31, 2013. This summary also provides information on whether or not each investment category complies with the limitations imposed by law and the City's Investment Policy. Investments that are subject to the Statement of Investment Policy are operating/idle funds invested by the Treasurer within the provisions of the approved Investment Policy. During the quarter ended March 31, 2013, the operating portfolio

decreased slightly by \$0.4 million from \$30.4 million to \$30.0 million. Even though the City received property tax and VLF revenues during this quarter, the increase in cash resulting from these receipts was largely offset by transferring \$1.7 million previously held Redevelopment Agency cash balance to the County Auditor-Controller for distribution to taxing entities as required under AB1x 26 and AB1484. Excluding this one-time transfer, cash inflows during the quarter from revenue receipts would have exceeded cash outflows from expenditures by \$1.3 million

Attachment 2 provides a graphical breakdown of the operating portfolio holdings by investment type as of March 31, 2013. This chart is for investments that are subject to the Investment Policy. The operating portfolio consisted of 91.7% investment in the State of California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF). The remaining 8.3% comprises of cash and certificates of deposit.

A summary of investments not subject to the provisions of the Investment Policy (bond proceeds and debt service reserve funds) is also shown on Attachment 1. These funds are invested in accordance with applicable bond indenture provisions. During the quarter ended March 31, 2013, bond proceeds and debt service reserve fund portfolio decreased by a net amount of \$0.1 million from \$25.8 million to \$25.7 million due to bond proceeds expenditures for sewer and water capital projects.

Attachment 3 provides a detailed listing of the City's portfolio holdings as required by the Government Code. In this listing, "N/A" is used to denote that the information is either not available or applicable. The market value of investments in LAIF has been reported to equal cost because the City's investments in the pool are readily liquid and the market value of these investments approximates cost. Agency Securities issued by United States Government Sponsored Entities (GSEs) are rated "AA+" by Moody's rating service and "AAA" by Fitch rating service.

CASH FLOWS

The first half of the fiscal year usually presents a challenging cash flow situation for the General Fund due largely to the lag in the receipt of tax revenues. Cash balances usually increase during the second half of the fiscal year. As of March 31, 2013, the General Fund cash balance was nearly \$3.8 million. Along with anticipated cash receipts, staff estimates that there will be sufficient cash to cover disbursements for the City and Successor Agency for the next six months ending September 30, 2013.

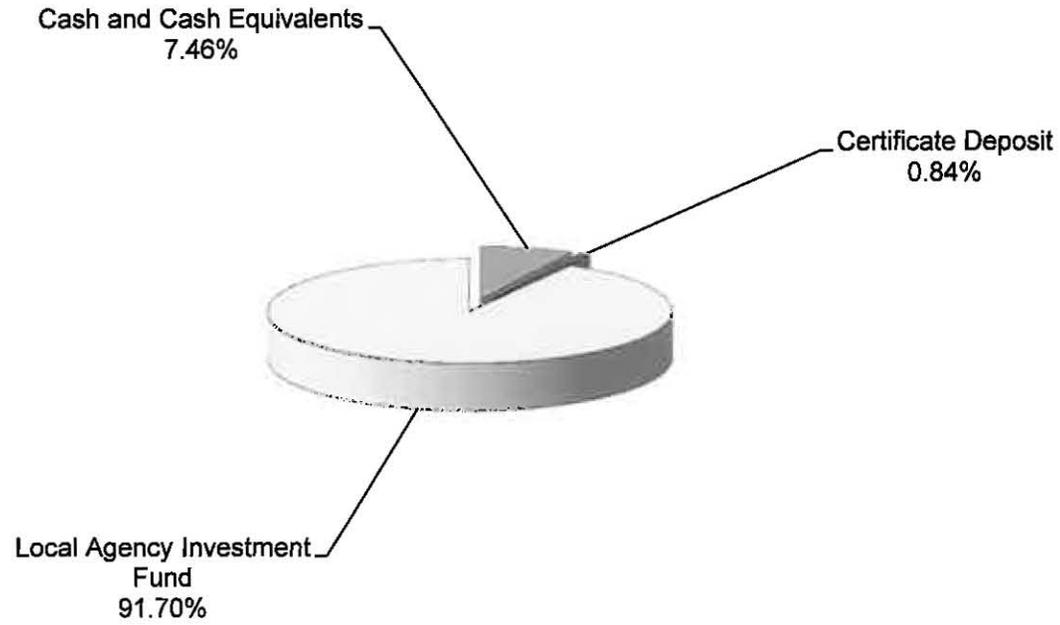

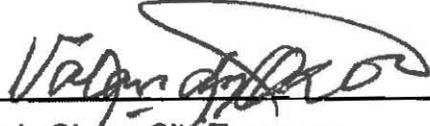

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council approve the naming of Field 2 at the Wayne Makin Sports Complex as the Dave Cummings Field.

SUMMARY: The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services received a request from Norco Little League (NLL) regarding the naming of Field 2 at the Wayne Makin Sports Complex after Dave Cummings (Exhibit "A"). Although this practice does not follow the normal criterion which states the individual must be deceased for 120 days, the organization believes that Mr. Cummings is worthy and meets the criteria for dedication by his devoted involvement with NLL.

Mr. Cummings was instrumental in encouraging youth to become involved in activities that promote health and wellness, foster human development, and provides a recreational experience. He understood the value of making a positive impact on other people's lives by his commitment to making each individual player feel special and developing their talent. His family, friends and good neighbors have him remembered for his love of coaching, managing and umpiring with Norco Little League.

BACKGROUND/ ANALYSIS: The Vice President of the NLL, Teresa Hyde, has requested that a portable backstop be placed on Field 2 in memory of Norco resident, Dave Cummings. Mr. Cummings was an avid volunteer in the community who not only volunteered in Norco Little League for 35 years, but was active in Norco Lions, Lioness, American Legion and Norco Chamber of Commerce.

The requesting organization for this dedication has provided the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services a petition with the required number of signatures requesting approval of this memorial (Exhibit "B") based on the City's Park and Public Building Dedication Criteria (Exhibit "C").

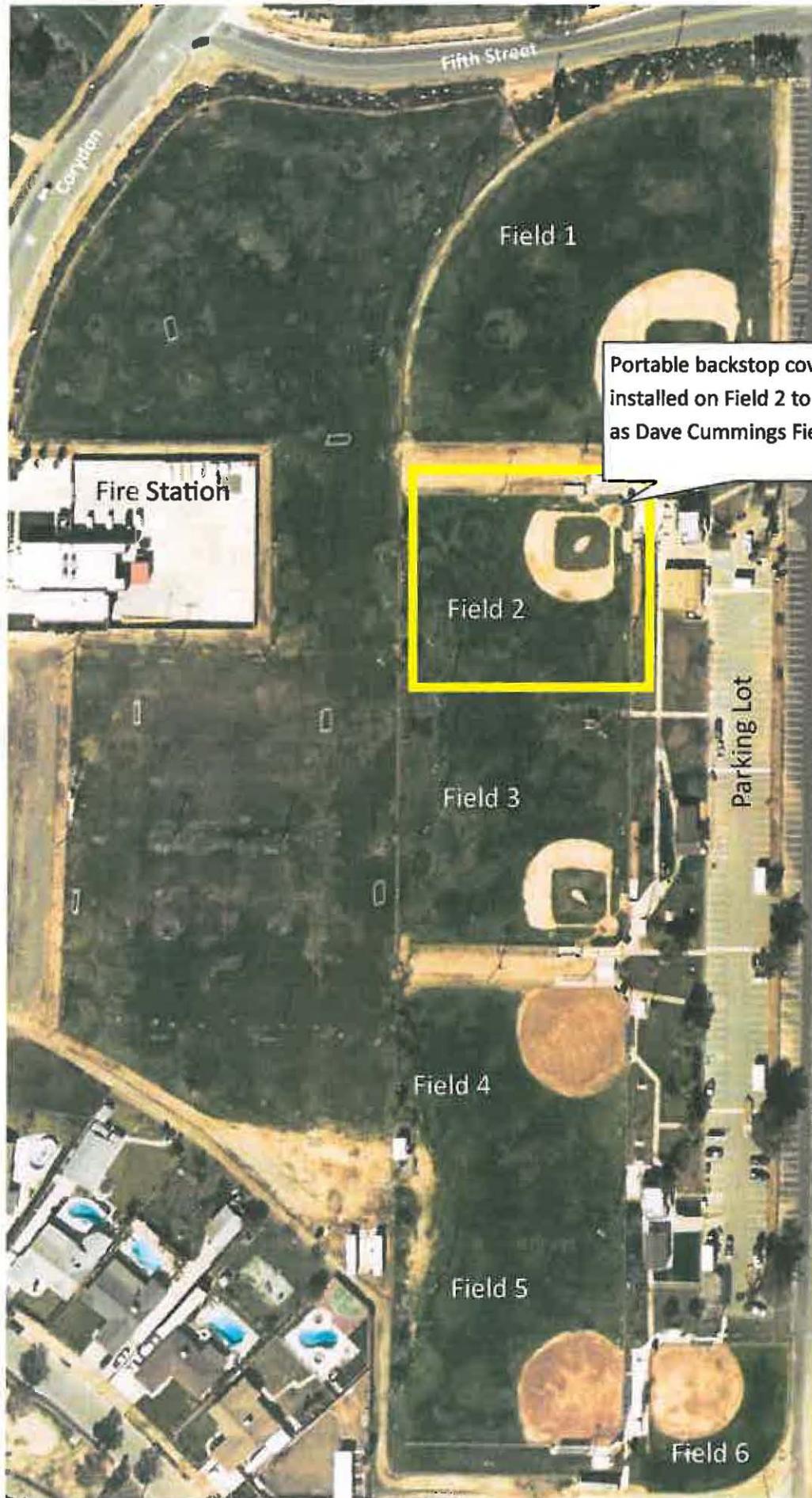

Wayne Makin Site Plan for Dave Cummings Field

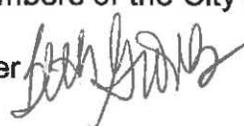

SUBJECT: Approval of a Contract to Purchase One CXT Precast ADA Restroom Using the Federal General Services Administration (GSA) Services Award Schedule

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute a contract in an amount not-to-exceed \$73,000 to purchase a precast ADA Restroom from CXT, Precast Products Inc., using the Federal General Services Administration (GSA) Schedule, Contract No. GS-07F-0602N.

SUMMARY: Staff is recommending the purchase of one prefabricated ADA restroom in the amount not-to-exceed \$73,000 for the Corydon Staging Area using the Federal General Services Administrations (GSA) Schedule, Contract No. GS-07F-0602N. GSA is a listing of Federal approved sellers of precast buildings, vehicles and equipment. The fabricated restroom is constructed using specified engineered materials from CXT, Precast Products, Inc., which are the approved source recommended under the GSA.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Staff recommends that the City Council approve a contract to purchase an ADA precast restroom and to authorize the City Manager to execute a contract for the purchase of the ADA restroom for the Corydon Staging Area/Santa Ana River Trails Parkway Program.

As part of the Master Plan for the Santa Ana River Trail and Parkway, the Corydon staging area identifies the placement of a restroom at the staging area. Staff has received a grant through the EDI, Federal Grant Administration in the amount of \$100,000 for the Santa Ana River Trail and Parkway Corydon Staging Area restroom project. As part of this project, the Engineering Division has designed site work to include sewer, water and power as a separate project to be ready with delivery of the precast restroom.

The Norco Municipal Code (Sec.3.24.140) gives authority to purchase from Governmental agencies both Federal and State through their General Services Award Schedule. GSA provides an approved source through CXT under GSA contract No.GS-07F-0602N.

The recommended restroom is an approved source from the GSA and has been applied in other parks with in the City. The restroom will be located at the west side of the parking lot that runs along Corydon identified on the site map (Exhibit "A"). This restroom is a double single occupancy restroom.

Precast restrooms are an excellent use at this facility and are recommended by the City Engineer. By purchasing through the GSA schedule, staff anticipates a savings as high as 15% over a conventional design. The 2013 Capital Improvement Program Budget identifies the restrooms as part of the improvements for the Santa Ana River Trail Parkway Capital Project for the Corydon Staging Area which is also identified in the approved Santa Ana River Trail Master Plan.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Funding for this project is included in the 2013 Capital Improvement Program Budget using EDI Grant funds of \$100,000 and Park Development Funds (Account # 141-940-43130).

SUBJECT: Acceptance of Bids and Award of Contract for the Norco MDP Line N-1A, N-1B and N-1E Project

RECOMMENDATION: Accept bids submitted for the construction of various storm drains and related appurtenances and award a contract to T.B.U., Inc. of Beaumont, CA in the amount of \$875,186.00, and authorize the City Manager to approve contract change orders up to 10 percent of the bid contract amounts.

SUMMARY: Bids for the Norco MDP Line N-1A, N-1B and N-1E Project were opened on April 3, 2013 with T.B.U., Inc. of Beaumont, CA being the lowest responsible bidder. Therefore, it is recommended that a contract be awarded to T.B.U., Inc. in the amount of \$875,186.00.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: The City of Norco contracted with Armstrong and Brooks Consulting Engineers, Inc. of Corona, to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of various storm drains and related appurtenances for these three Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Master Drainage Plan lines. The projects are Lateral N-1A which is closed conduit in Center Street from Seventh Street to approximately 1,150 feet north; Lateral N-1B, a closed conduit in Hillside Avenue from Seventh Street to approximately 1,600 feet south; and Lateral N-1E, a closed conduit in Center Street from Seventh Street to approximately 400 feet north. The plans include construction of various size RCP, catch basins, local depressions and related road improvements. The plans and specifications were advertised on March 4, 2013 with a bid opening date of April 3, 2013. A total of 14 bids were received with proposals ranging in value from \$875,186.00 to \$1,334,256.00. The low bid of \$875,186 was 20% lower than the engineer's estimate of \$1,050,000. The bid summary sheet has been attached for Council's review.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Funds for this project in the amount of \$1,363,404 are included in the FY 2013-2017 Storm Drain Capital Improvement Budget Fund 139
