NORCO DOG LICENSING

In the effort to make the dog licensing process more convenient for our Norco residents, you are allowed to purchase a one, two or three year dog license as long as the Rabies Vaccination will not lapse during the licensing period. **All dogs are required by law to be licensed by the age of four (4) months.** To purchase a dog license, the dog must be vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian and the owner must provide a California approved rabies vaccination certificate. Initial rabies vaccinations are good for a 12-month period, but subsequent vaccinations will provide up to three (3) years of protection. If your pet has been spayed or neutered and you provide proof of this sterilization, your licensing fee will be reduced. Remember, a licensed dog identifies the dog and the owner.

Why do I need to have a yearly dog license in Norco?

The State of California Health and Safety Code, (Section 121690) requires that all dogs over the age of 4 months be licensed. A valid rabies certificate must be provided before a dog can be licensed in the city.

The license is the tool used to insure all Norco dogs are up to date on their rabies vaccination. It is also a great way to insure that if your dog gets out of its yard, it is returned to you quickly. We do offer multi-year licenses with discounts, and seniors 62 or over will be offered a senior rate on all altered dogs.

All dog owners must renew their dog's license when they are due. Norco Animal Control has begun issuing Administrative Tickets to owners that do not renew their dog's license in a timely manner.

Why did I get a pink notice on my door from Animal Control?

Once a year, our officers will canvass your neighborhood, and leave a courtesy door hanger if we do not show any licensed dogs at your address. We frequently have new people moving into our neighborhoods who may not be aware of our licensing policies, and this allows us to keep new Norconians informed, as well as keeping our records as up to date as possible. We really appreciate those who take the time to call us and let us know they do not have any dogs! If you see our officers out in your neighborhood, take the time to say hi and feel free to ask our officers any animal control questions you may have!

LEASH LAW:

City of Norco Animal Control would like to remind you that a leash law is in effect city-wide. Remember to have your dog(s) on a leash at all times to avoid a possible citation. In the City of Norco, dogs must be leashed anytime they are in public. Remember, this also applies if your dog is with you when horseback riding.

FRIENDLY REMINDER:

Effective September 1st, 2014, Norco Animal Control Services will be issuing Administrative Citations for parking in the horse trails.

ADOPTIONS:

Thank you for choosing to adopt an animal and join others in the effort of saving lives. All dog adoption fees are \$88. All puppy adoption fees are \$108. All cat adoption fees are \$67. RESPECT YOUR NEIGHBOR:

Not everyone will love your pet as much as you do. Keep your dog(s), cat(s), chicken(s), etc on your property. Don't force your pet's company on your neighbor or his property.

SPAY, NEUTER & VACCINATE YOUR PETS:

Please be a responsible pet owner!! Spay and neuter your unaltered pets. Kitten and Puppy season is right around the corner. Every year we receive a large number of cats and dogs that have not been vaccinated and come into our shelter ill. In turn they infect other animals that are waiting to be redeemed or adopted.

UNDERAGE DRINKING IS NOT A MINOR THING!



Underage drinking has been a long-standing problem in the United States. Most youth cannot fully understand the effects of alcohol. The resulting impairment, poses health problems and endangers the safety of others. The consumption of alcohol has been glorified by television, movies, and peer pressure among youths. The challenge in this area is to educate our youth prior to them being subjected to the false glory of alcohol consumption. This is easier said than done. While education is an integral part of reducing substance/alcohol abuse, it is difficult for a person/group outside of one's family unit to affect change.

It is well-known that underage drinking can result in impaired judgment, injuries, irregular brain development, criminal behavior, or death. There are many more negatives, but with proper education and intervention techniques, we can reduce or lessen the impact of the dangers of alcohol on our youth. There are many educational resources in print and available on the Internet. In order for an education/prevention program to be successful, it must address family, school, and environmental factors.

Family members must be prepared to educate, enforce, and train those susceptible to substance abuse. Parents should engage into the life and development of their children. Former First Lady Nancy Reagan spearheaded the "Just Say No" campaign in the 1980s. This encouraged individuals to empower themselves to say no to drugs. To this day the "Just Say No" slogan is still popular. We still need to emphasize that family members should continue to encourage and support the denial of succumbing to alcohol or drugs. Saying, "No" to alcohol should not make someone feel awkward or embarrassed.

Since students are educated in the school system, what better way to support the family values than to encourage, educate, and reward positive behavior against alcohol/substance abuse. Teachers and friends can often provide a support network for a troubled individual who may be susceptible to substance abuse. An excellent deterrent against alcohol/drugs, is to get the at-risk person engaged in life. This means having them become involved in extracurricular activities, such as playing sports, getting involved in the community events, or even volunteerism.

The thing to remember is that alcohol abuse is not someone else's problem, it is our problem. It is not going to go away or reduce, without any intervention. We can do something now or pay for it later.

United Norconians for Life Over Alcohol and Drugs (U.N.L.O.A.D.)

The mission of UNLOAD is to educate and bring awareness to youth, parents and community members about alcohol and substance abuse as well as other concerning issues that negatively impact youth in the City of Norco. UNLOAD meetings are a great way for the public to discuss issues they see in the community related to youth and want to bring awareness to others, as well as brainstorm strategies to educate society on the dangers of alcohol and substance abuse.



Halloween Safety Tips



HALLOWEEN IS A FUN AND SPOOKY TIME OF YEAR FOR KIDS. MAKE TRICK-OR-TREATING SAFE FOR YOUR LITTLE MONSTERS WITH A FEW SAFETY TIPS.



CHOOSING THE RIGHT COSTUMES:

- Purchase costumes made of flame retardant material (check the label).
- Keep hemlines short enough to prevent tripping and avoid loose, baggy sleeves, or billowing skirts.
- To be seen easily, costumes should be made of a light color material.
- Use glow in the dark reflective tape on your costume.
- Use make-up rather than masks which could obstruct vision. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so they can see out.
- Provide children with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.



TIPS FOR HALLOWEEN NIGHT:

- Use battery powered lights - NEVER USE CANDLES - to light jack-o-lanterns.
- Instruct children to stay away from open flames.
- Remove objects from the yard that present a hazard to children (garden tools, hoses, etc.).
- Be extremely careful with cornstalks and other harvest season items. Keep them away from sources of heat. Don't let them block doorways or stairs.
- Do not allow children to carry sharp sticks or other objects that could cause injury to others.

The kitchen is the heart of the home, especially at Thanksgiving. Kids love to be involved in holiday preparations. Safety in the kitchen is important, especially on Thanksgiving Day when there is a lot of activity and people at home.

- ◆ Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.

- ◆ Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

Here are some tips to protect yourself, your loved ones and your home when temperatures drop:

- **Remember the three feet rule.** If you are using a space heater, place it on a level hard surface and keep anything flammable at least three feet away (such as paper, clothing, bedding, and rugs.)
- **Supervision required.** Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- **Prevent catching yourself or items on fire!** When using a fireplace, make sure to use a glass or metal fire screen large enough to catch sparks and rolling logs. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance from your home.
- **Kitchen appliances are for cooking only.** Never use a stove or oven to heat your home.
- **Use generators outside.** Never operate a generator inside the home, including in the basement or garage. Don't hook up a generator to the home's wiring. The safest thing to do is to connect the equipment you want to power directly to the outlets on the generator.
- **Layer up!** Wear layers of lightweight clothing to stay warm. Gloves and a hat will help prevent losing your body heat.
- **Don't forget about your furry family.** Bring pets indoors. If they can't come inside, make sure they have enough shelter to keep them warm.

SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES.

Roughly **two thirds** of home fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms



Smoke alarms should be **installed** on every level of the home, outside each sleeping area and inside each bedroom.

For the best protection, **interconnect** all the smoke alarms so when one sounds, they all sound.

Replace smoke alarms **10** years from the date of manufacture.

Test all smoke alarms at least **once a month** by pushing the test button.



When the smoke alarm sounds, **get outside and stay outside.**
Go to your **outside meeting place.** **Call the fire department** from a cell or neighbor's phone.
Stay outside until the fire department tells you it is safe to go back inside.
